School Profile

Westmount School is a Kindergarten to Grade 6 school that has a student population of just over 400. Our programming includes fulltime kindergarten classes with the option for regular kindergarten embedded. This provides our families with the opportunity to choose the program that best meets their needs. Throughout Grades 1 to 6, we have either 2 or 3 classes at each grade level. Additionally, we have Music and Physical Education programs taught by specialists. Our Hockey Program, offered to interested Grade 5 and 6 students, continues to grow and is in its 9th year. Our Strive program serves children with varying educational challenges. Each of these students is provided with individualized programming to meet diverse academic, social, and behavioural needs.



Student Success ~ Strategies


- Connect teachers with professional development opportunities to ensure best practices when implementing programs and strategies to support student learning.
- Provide collaborative PLC time with grade-level teaching partners to design lessons and assessments that increase thinking and lead to deeper student understanding.
- Provide students with a variety of ways to 'show what they know'.
- Provide students with online support such as speech-to-text or a reader through access to Read & Write for Google.
- Participate in division-wide focus groups that are topic or subject-specific.
- Ensure appropriate and effective assessment of student learning.
- Access support from Instructional Coaches to implement differentiated strategies and assistive technology to ensure all students are successful in the classroom.
- With support from experts, collaboratively design learning opportunities that address areas of challenge as indicated by Provincial Achievement Test results.
- Support Plans (Individual Program Plans, Individual Support Plans, Behaviour Management Plans, and Medical Management Plans) are designed around individual student success, differentiation, and the use of effective accommodations. These plans are created with input from families.
- All students have access to technology (Chromebooks/iPads/View Sonic Boards) to support learning in meaningful and engaging ways to increase student achievement.







Parental Engagement:

To ensure that families engage with our school, we aim to offer multiple opportunities for them to provide input and hear directly from the administration and teaching staff. This is achieved through the following strategies:

- Continue to communicate with families and the community about Westmount School, upcoming events, and its students' accomplishments. This is done through our website, social media, weekly emails from teachers, and our bimonthly school newsletter.
- Encourage parental input in regard to their child's Individual Program Plan.
- Foster the positive relationship we have with our School Council.
- Continue to tweak our school newsletter to make it interesting, informative, and easy to read.
- Our student government enables our student population to maintain a direct line of communication with the school administration. This is vital in maintaining a positive school culture.
- Continue to employ a collaborative decision-making model.

Opportunities for Students:

- Cybernetics is a class for our Grade 5 and 6 students that is designed to help students navigate the world of technology in a way that they can solve problems and address needs. Students learn about digital platforms, coding, and 3D printing through the Design Thinking process for innovation.
- Makerspace, which occurs on Fridays in the library, provides students with the opportunity to explore an ever-changing assortment of activities that involve designing, building, and creating.
- Hockey Program for interested Grade 5 & 6 students takes place twice each week. During this time, students learn about collaboration, perseverance, and teamwork.
- Our yearly Collaborative Drama Production engages interested Grade 5 & 6 students as actors and encourages students to take risks. Every student and staff member plays a role in the production through multi-graded departments such as Costumes, Props, Advertising, and Choreography to name a few.

First Nations, Metis, and Inuit Connections:

- For the 2022 23 school year, we have a full-time Siksika liaison who works with students academically and culturally. This role is designed to provide our First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students with ongoing support, positive relationships, and strong, meaningful connections to culture.
- Our Siksika liaison builds relationships and connections that encourage cultural understanding and celebration among all of our students. With these relationships, we endeavour to foster self-confidence and further develop successful learners. Every month, our liaison presents to each class about a cultural topic. Most often, these presentations are linked to school-wide events such as Orange Shirt Day, Indigenous Peoples Day, Ribbon Skirt & Shirt Day, Rock Your Mocs, and Chief & Council elections to name a few.
- Westmount School strives to be inclusive in all that we do. All students participate in activities that promote Blackfoot culture.
- Pookaiks 'Children' Club provides students will an additional opportunity to explore the Blackfoot Culture. This club meets at recess and is designed to further delve into culture.
- Miss Westmount School and Westmount's Warrior represent Westmount School at Powwows and other events throughout the year.
- Westmount School's Chief & Council takes a school leadership role alongside our Grade 6 Student Government.








Goal #3: Utilize researched best practices to enhance literacy, numeracy and technology use school-wide to increase academic achievement for all students.

- To ensure a positive learning environment for all students, we have a collaborative approach with students, families and staff. We are community focused.
- Identify competencies, attitudes and behaviours essential for success as an engaged citizen and communicate to families how these are taught through conversations, modelling and social media.
- Teachers access support from Instructional Coaches to implement differentiation strategies and assistive technology to ensure all students are successful in the classroom.
- Our Strive program is designed to meet the diverse needs of our learners while also being inclusive. Students work on individualized goals independently, in small groups, and within classroom settings. Inclusion is the ultimate goal for all our students.
- Our Resource Team meets weekly to explore opportunities and supports needed for students to reach their full potential. This is a highly collaborative approach and relies on the strengths of all staff and school partners.
- Teaching staff is always a part of the decision-making process regarding programs and options available at Westmount School. These decisions take place during monthly staff meetings and at our yearly planning session in May.
- Music (K 4) and Physical Education Specialists to provide high-quality instruction in each subject.
- First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students have access to learning supports including Emerging Readers, Early Literacy and Numeracy, and Family School Community Resource Program.








